Do No Harm

- Always practice within your area of expertise. Seek support or consult with experts when necessary.
- Avoid using punishment procedures or harmful reinforcers.
- Obtain caregiver/parent consent for program goals and interventions.

Respect Autonomy

- Promote client independence and self-sufficiency.
- Fade prompts to prevent learned helplessness.
- Allow clients to make choices in their programs when appropriate (e.g., reinforcers, schedules).

Benefit Others

- Ensure your work improves the lives of clients in any setting.
- Address the concerns of caregivers and families, tailoring programs to individual needs.
- Safeguard the rights and welfare of all involved.

Be Just

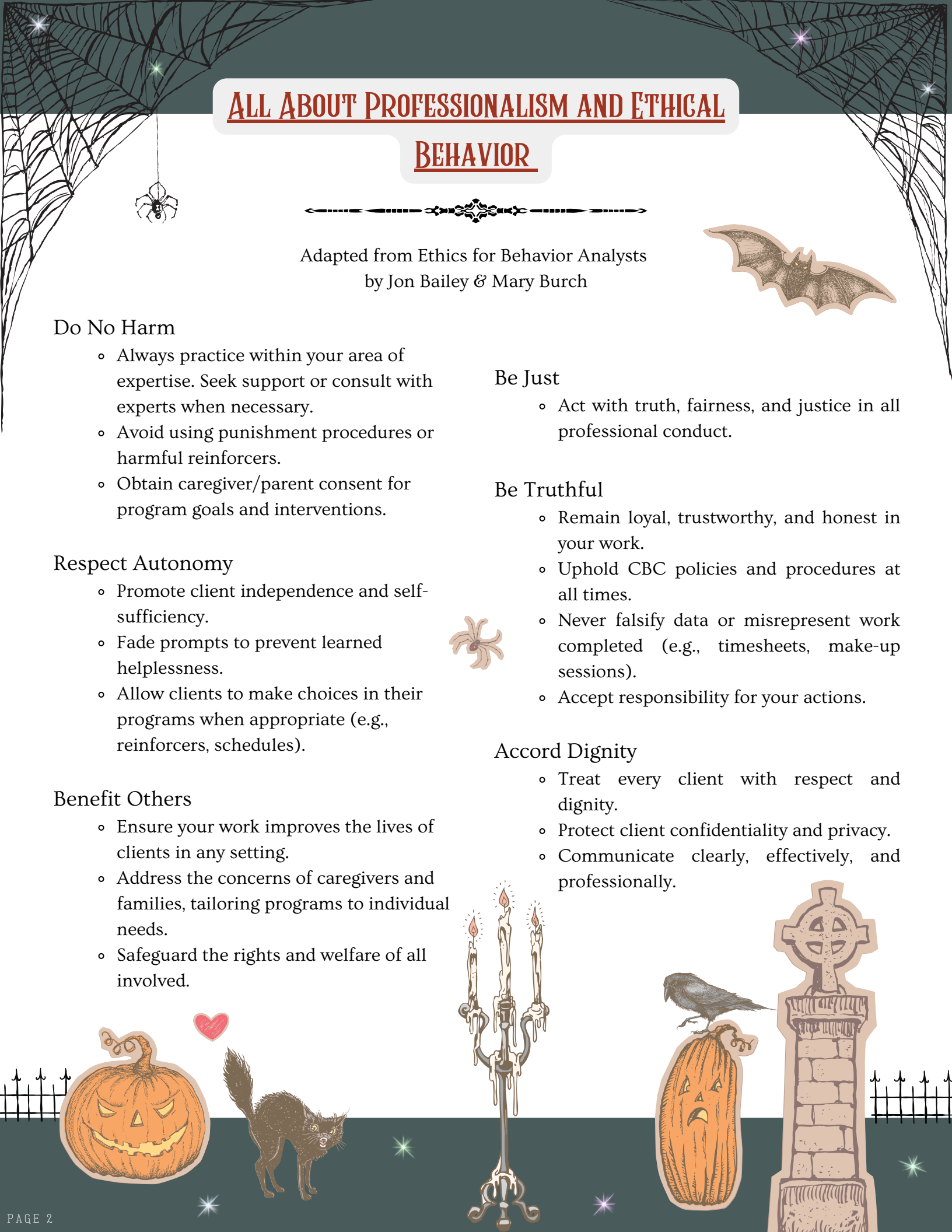
- Act with truth, fairness, and justice in all professional conduct.

Be Truthful

- Remain loyal, trustworthy, and honest in your work.
- Uphold CBC policies and procedures at all times.
- Never falsify data or misrepresent work completed (e.g., timesheets, make-up sessions).
- Accept responsibility for your actions.

Accord Dignity

- Treat every client with respect and dignity.
- Protect client confidentiality and privacy.
- Communicate clearly, effectively, and professionally.





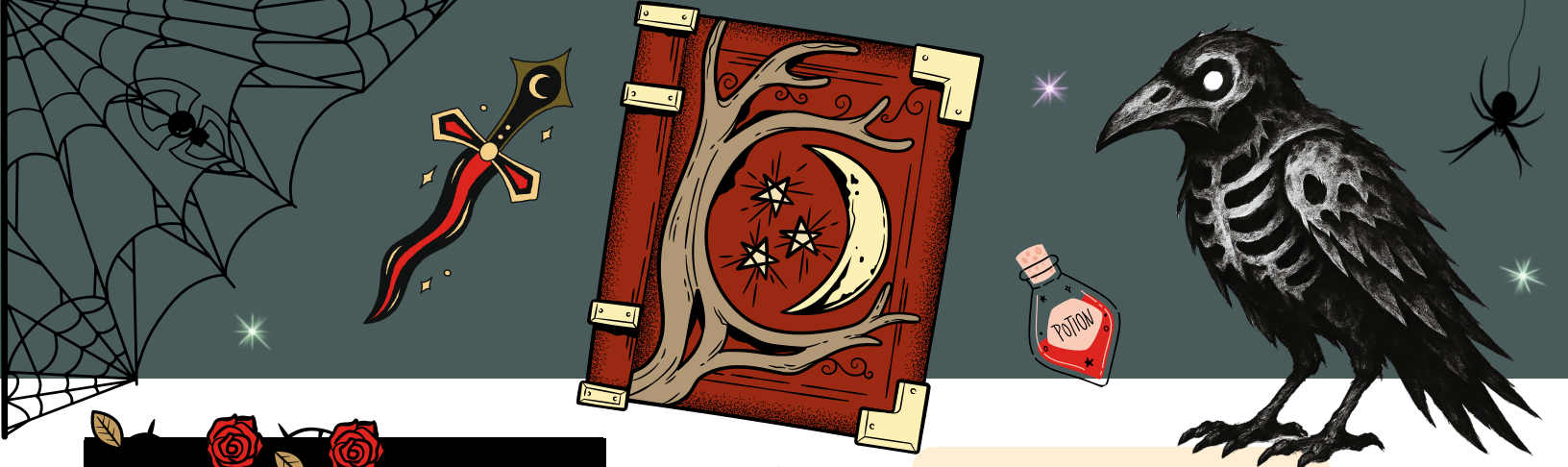
